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MOORAGE MATTERS:

Dredging is complete on Walks 1, 2 and 5 in the places that needed more depth. All boats are back in their slips and the dredge, aka "Old Slurpy," is parked and winterized.

The subject of trailer parking in the parking lot comes up regularly. Each resident household has permission to temporarily park a small runabout boat and/or trailer. The Club has two trailers for our workboats. We let one regular dock repair contractor use our lot to store his trailer while he works on our moorage or on nearby moorages, because he has rendered yeoman service to RCYC for several decades, always for reasonable cost. The Club does NOT allow long-term storage of member trailers. Nope. Not even for a fee. The Board discusses this just about every year, and has kept the policy unchanged in the 13 years since I joined. As a courtesy, members are allowed to temporarily leave their boat and/or trailer in the lot. We have always been very flexible about how many days constitute "temporary." Beyond a month, however, we are well out of the allowed time period.

At present, at the west end, there appear to be two sailboat trailers parked there. The owners need to contact me soon to discuss the departure date of their trailers. In the future, anyone temporarily leaving their trailer in the lot must let the Port Captain or a Resident member know, and give the dates of arrival and departure of their trailer.



Final work hour summaries have been tallied. The results may be found on the work hour clipboard at the back of the clubhouse. This year has been a busy one. The club racked up 6,124.5 work hours performed. And, with dredging season done early, there probably won't be too many hours tallied between now and the first spring work party. Hopefully, our dredge crew won't suffer from work party withdrawal symptoms. In reviewing the final tallies, I noted that there are a core of people who make themselves and their talents readily available for work projects at the club. They are as follows: (1) Over 100 hours accumulated - Pat Adams, Loren Beach, Terry Foren, John Flenniken, Doug Hepburn, Mike Oxborrow, Mike Pick, Ken Purvine, Dick Royce, and Pete Unger; (2) Over 200 hours accumulated - Jim Douglass, Paul Glynn, Mike Godsil, Bob Phillips, and Tom Stringfield; (3) Over 400 hours accumulated – Bob Fellman and (drum roll, blare of trumpets) (4) Over 500 hours accumulated – Larry Corderman. The work hours performed by these individuals account for 3,415.25 of the hours worked at the club during the entire year. In addition, life members (who have no work hour obligations) have performed 525.5 work hours. At the November Board meeting, the Board should finalize the new clubhouse rental agreement. Only RCYC member sponsored events will be permitted. Parties sponsored by RCYC members for outside organizations to which they also belong will require Board approval. The charge for Corinthian meetings and not for profit educational programs was raised from \$25 to \$35 per event. Other fees remained unchanged. A refundable cleaning deposit of \$200 will be required for all events. We have clarified the responsibilities of the sponsoring member. Cleaning requirements are spelled out in the rental agreement, and we have instituted a walk-through policy for the morning following the event to assess whether the facility was left clean. And, we will track all events for adherence to policies, cleanliness, etc., to determine whether future usage of the club would be permitted. These changes should eliminate past problems.

With your December billings you will also receive, for completion and return with your payment, the annual form to update the yearbook and emergency contact list. Please promptly review the information and return the form so we can get an early completion of the yearbook in 2005. Also, attached to the form will be the 2005 membership cards.

And, finally, thank you for electing me Commodore for 2005. It is an honor to serve the club as Commodore and I look forward to a great year.


