### **Moorage Matters**

As the Foghorn goes to press, the river has recently risen too high to continue dredging on walk four. Hopefully, it should be down to normal levels by next week. The outer half of the walk four fairway is all that remains on the schedule for this season. Then the Big Iron Sand Pump will be put to bed for another year.

I am presently filling two openings in our moorage from the Lists. We also have three more new members now proceeding through the membership process. It looks like the wait for a new slip will remain at a year or maybe a bit longer.

If your boat (still) has 2010 Oregon registration stickers on it, you are required to get the 2012 ones on very soon. The River Patrol Deputies usually walk our moorage in January or February. If you are uncertain just how and where to display your new stickers, just read the instructions on the form that they are attached to. Documented boats have to display theirs on both sides, adjacent to the stern.

Recently a boat was spotted with a broken mooring line. Be aware that the club has authorized the Residents and Port Captain to attach new dock lines, and bill them to you at market rates. Their time to do the work is valued at a nominal \$50./hour.

Check your lines for chafe, and check your bilges regularly while you're there.
