From the Rear Chuck Silver - Rear Commodore

As we head into the New Year, there will be new projects and continuation of old projects. Having had a year of Commodore behind me and four years on the Board, I hope to be a help to our new Commodore, Bill Kramer, and the board in general.

I would again like to thank all who made 2011 a great year! We didn't do earth shattering accomplishments like replacing a wooden walk with a brand new concrete one, but we did make progress. We are financially solid, in a down economy, and can afford improvements. We do have some big projects coming down the pike.

We will continue the resurfacing of the East ramp (all materials have been purchased), replace water lines on another walk or two, move forward in the spring with landscaping around the new concrete slab where the shelter and ice box are located, and start new work.

A yacht club is like a farm, the work is never done. You do as much as you can today, but there is always work to do tomorrow. It is a never ending job and that is OK. I still want to encourage all to step forward and offer to volunteer with club responsibilities. I know from experience many of you are willing and when asked directly, you volunteer. But, please don't wait for someone to ask. Let a board member know you are available.

I am looking forward to the Commodore's Ball on February 4th. Hope to see you there. Also, Opening Day will be here before you know it. Have you seen the pile of sand the dredging crew is producing in the parking lot? There is much happening and much to look forward to.







Moorage Matters

It's winter, so dredging is ongoing and we next plan to dig out a lot of newly-deposited sand from walks four and five. The moorage waiting list is slowly growing, and it may well take at least a year for a new member to have their own slip. We have waiting list boats temporarily using every slip where the assigned boat is in the yard or on its trailer through this winter.

Chafe. I recently found and fixed a source that had chafed through one of the three strands of my bow line last winter. It turns out that those large galvanized cleats on the concrete docks can have some rough places in the galvanizing; sharp enough to wear the line. I wrapped the cleat base where the line goes around with some plastic tape to provide a smooth surface. So far, so good for the new line.

Winter has been mild up to press time, but the severe storm and freezing season will last through January or well into February. Be sure that you have drained or protected the water system in your boat and also anti-freeze the raw water side of the engine coolant system. Try to keep your bilge dried out as much as you can, every week, when it's raining. Keeping moisture out of the boat interior is key to reducing or eliminating mold growth.

When traversing our docks the next several months be cautious of ice and frost.
