#### Moorage Matters

Dinghy docks are in need of better signage. So, if you have a dinghy parked on any one of our five docks/racks, put a plastic or metal name plate on your spot. If you have a kayak or canoe on one of the top slots, be sure that it does not protrude far enough over the marginal walk where someone might be injured by walking into it.

Recent high winds have chafed through some dock lines and tore a lid off one dock box. You should really inspect your lines closely where they cross the edge of your deck or go through a chock.

Be careful walking around on the frost and ice on the docks.

### Nautical Reads

This month's column is courtesy of Carl Nielsen. Our featured book is *PACIFIC* by Simon Winchester

*Pacific*, by Simon Winchester, is a collection of essays about political, scientific, social and ecological issues that touch the Pacific region. These range from the development of the transistor radio in Japan, America's atomic and



hydrogen bomb testing, volcanic eruptions, China's increasing projects to control of the South China Sea, surfing, how world weather patterns are driven by the Pacific region, and many more.

*Pacific*'s organization is unusual in that it develops a list of somewhat unrelated events and then moves back and forth from a concentration on the Pacific ocean itself to essays about countries that are located in and around the Pacific basin. The book arrangement is somewhat chronological, but the intent seems to be to give a sense of the complexity and interconnection of the various topics

The chapters start with short historical or human stories and segue into larger topics. For example, one chapter starts with the eruption of Mt. Pinutubo in the Philippines which destroyed two major US bases, then segues into another "volcano", the growing Chinese economic and military strength, including their current strategy of extending China's realm into the South China Sea. Other chapters discuss the pleasures of the laid-back lifestyle in Hawaii, the paranoid regime of North Korea, the former British colony Hong Kong, and storms in southern Pacific and Australia.

Included in the book's wide range of topics are deep-sea exploration, the Pacific's volcanoes, plate tectonics, and environmental problems, Of particular interest to me was a discussion of the American role in nuclear testing in the Marshall Islands in the 1950's in which I participated while serving in the Navy.

Using the example of the story of the Hawai'ian ocean-going canoe Hokole'a, Winchester makes hopeful comments on the growth of mutual respect and understanding developing within the area. *Pacific* is a fascinating read that covers a very wide range of stories about the Pacific Ocean area, including many interesting essays about little known but related topics.

#### Membership Reminders and Notices

**Membership Cards** - Your 2017 membership cards were mailed out early in December. If you have not received a membership card or if there were problems with it (new spouse, name change, incorrect address), please send an email to Judy Oxborrow judy87807@ centurylink.net

**Billings** - As of June 2016, all members should be mailing their quarterly dues payments to Rose City Yacht Club, c/o ebs Associates Inc., 7150 SW Hampton St., Suite 200, Tigard, OR 97223. If you have not yet changed this address on your bill pay list with your financial institution, please do so. Some members are still using an incorrect address.

If you use a bill pay system through your financial institution, chances are the checks are mailed from a central location in another state. Most such systems advise to allow 5-7 business days for delivery. If the payment is sent to an incorrect address, it takes another 7-10 days to filter back through the mail system to your financial organization. And, then the financial organization has to determine what to do with it. This month two members were notified by their financial organization about returned payments -- sent out in late October. Another financial organization mailed two such returned payments to the Club's physical address.

Effective January 2017, late fees will not automatically be forgiven for payments sent to the wrong address. Payments received after February I will be assessed a late fee. The bookkeeping service cannot forgive late fees. If you are assessed a late fee, contact Judy Oxborrow (*judy87807@centurylink.net*) to resolve. If the payment is late because you are still using the wrong address, you may be advised to present your case for waiver of the late fee to the Board.

Your billing is being sent via email, unless you have specifically advised the Treasurer that you do not want email billing. The email comes from Rose City Yacht Club <<u>quickbooks@notification.intuit.com</u>> so you might want to add this to your address book so your email doesn't think it is spam.

**Yearbook** – By the time you receive the January Foghorn, you should have already submitted updates, changes, and new photographs to the yearbook crew. If you have not done so, please submit any changes to <u>rcycyearbook@gmail.com</u> immediately. We are aiming to have the file at the printer by the end of January, with expected delivery in February 2017. **E-Mails** – E-mails sent out to the Club via the Everyone-at-RCYC mailing list go into a queue for review. This queue is monitored; however, it could be several minutes before your email appears in the inbox of members. This is done to eliminate spam received at the Everyone-at-RCYC address from going out to all members. With the holiday season, the amount of spam has increased substantially. Club email goes through a list server (Simplelists). At the end of each Club email you receive will be the following line ---

If you accidentally unsubscribed and deleted the notification email from your inbox, you can send an email to Judy Oxborrow (*judy87807@centurylink.net*). She can add you back on to the Club's email list.

#### **RCYC Education Offerings for 2017**

Ahoy fellow RCYC members. Each year the Club offers a handful of educational opportunities for members to help increase their understanding of many boating-related issues. Last spring we had a session on VHS radio, focusing on DSC and MMSI set up and usage. There was also a very informative presentation about standing rigging and how we should change our 20 year old rigging every 5 years! In past years, the Club has presented First Aid, CPR and Defibrillator classes.

Any educational program that helps us be safer, more self-reliant and happier boaters is what RCYC is all about.

So, I invite you to think about what learning sessions you would like to see offered this year. Some experiences could be presented as a program at our monthly general meetings or an hour or two before a walk party. Others, such as a First Aid class may take six hours on a Saturday. So far, ideas include:

- First Aid/CPR/Defibrillator
- 12V charging options (wind, solar, fuel cell)
- Pre-Season/Post-Season boat prep
- Exterior maintenance
- Electronic charts usage
- Cruising North for the summer
