Breakwater Discussion: (Christian Steinbrecher)

The costs for either solution cover a very wide range, with the current estimate for new concrete at 1.5 to 2 million dollars. The previous complete rebuild in 2005 cost about \$50K and that would be almost \$80K in 2023 dollars.
